Personal Hand Drum Class

On May 12, Tony Showa, Navajo, will teach a class for ages 12 and up how to make a personal hand drum and drum beater. Tony is from the Four Corners Area of the US. He follows the Dine traditional way of living in *hozho*, which is, attaining and living in harmony and happiness. He is a pow wow and ceremonial singer and drummer. Sharing Native American stories and playing music while making drums will be part of the class so the students will have a better understanding of what the drum can do for them. Students will make a 15" single-sided hand drum using natural elk hide with maple or yellow cedar frame and the beater. Class limit is 8 students and Tony will supply all materials needed.

The cost for this class is \$120, including all instruction and materials. *This activity is made possible in part by The Indiana Arts Commission, a state agency, and the National Endowment for the Arts, a federal agency.*
