Copper Embossing Class – Robin McBride Scott
Jay Community Resource Center, 118 South Meridian Street, Portland, Indiana
December 8, 2018 – 10 am. to 3 p.m.

This class is for adults and children age 8 and up. There is no class fee except \$8 to cover the cost of the materials used. Pre-registration is requested to assure adequate supply of materials for the class.

Robin McBride Scott is well-known as an artist and for her research into pre-contact river cane basketry and mats. She has participated in the Smithsonian Carriers of Culture and as an artist in residence at the Eiteljorg Museum. Around 200 B.C. artists of the Hopewell Culture of the Midwest brought techniques of working copper to high levels of technical skills. They flattened natural nuggets of copper into beads, ear spools and many other adornments. By the Middle Woodland period, artists began using repousse, chasing, cladding, sinking forms and cutting templates as they placed greater emphasis on motif and design.

Students will learn copper working techniques repousse and chasing in this class, using 40 gauge copper foil sheeting, to create an embossed metals piece. Students can select a Hopewell design or create their own design on their piece. The material fee of \$8 covers all supplies needed. Students may want to bring paper and pencil for taking notes. *This event is made possible in part by Region 5 Partner Community Foundation of Randolph County, the Indiana Arts Commission and the National Endowment for the Arts.*
