ALL UNVACCINATED PARTICIPANTS ARE REQUIRED TO WEAR A MASK IN THE TAF BUILDING.

Buckskin Tulip Bags are used as part of traditional women's apparel. Tulip bags are made from four to six panels that are sewn together creating a bag that expands. Students will be making a four panel Tulip Bag using commercially tanned deerskin, needles, thread, wax, ribbon and seed beads. Students will learn how to do edge beadwork on the seams of the bag to create a delicate lace edging. All materials will be supplied. Bring a pencil and paper for taking notes and a small craft light if desired. Cost for workshop is materials fee only - \$25.00. No class fee in honor of Native American History Month.
