We have seen too many of our treasured elders and tradition bearers begin their Spirit Journey without knowing who would carry on in their place. Over the past 21 years, the Center's tribal elders, tradition bearers and members have been presenting at workshops, symposia, university classrooms, conferences, pow wows, elementary schools, libraries, and other cultural and educational events. We look forward to helping Native peoples, urban cultural centers, universities, pubic and private elementary and secondary schools, and the general public raise their awareness and understanding of the cultural heritage and history of the Great Lakes Native peoples in an inviting, comfortable place with a friendly learning environment.

NCGLNAC now owns nearly 30 acres (generously donated by the Jay County Fair Board) of beautiful, wooded land, complete with grassland, pond and wetlands, located just north of the Jay County Fairgrounds in Portland. The first ethno-botanical hiking trail was opened to the public in 2008.
